Dear Business Owners and Constituents in the Township of Bonfield,

On behalf of Council, it is my pleasure to introduce the Township's new Business Retention and Expansion (BR+E) Initiative: "Growing Bonfield Together: Community Business Survey 2025". It has been several years since the Township focused its efforts on community economic development. In recent weeks, Council adopted a brand-new Strategic Plan and provided staff with direction to pursue a detailed Economic Development Strategy for the Township as a whole.



And now, with your input, we'd like to uncover our core strengths; our economic assets; and the existing businesses that may require extra support. We also want to learn from those businesses that are already succeeding and assist their future growth potential. Inevitably, by increasing our employment base, we will become more sustainable and resilient as a community.

As many will understand, a large proportion of the inward investment we're currently experiencing has been fueled by new land division and house-building projects. Local area developers, consultants, and general contractors are a hugely important contributor to economic growth within our Township. The program will officially be launched in October 2025, with interviews to be scheduled until mid-January 2026. The team will then analyze and report back on the results by the Summer of 2026! Office Septic Tank Replacement

A new septic system to be installed at the Township Office to match the updated use, as the original tank was intended to be used for the change room only. The contract was awarded to AMV Septic and Plumbing who will install a new tank with a 11,000 litre capacity in late September

New radio system for Emergency Services

The Township of Bonfield's Emergency Services and the Bonfield Fire Department have approved a bid from Spectrum to upgrade the Fire Department's radio communications system. This will include the supply and installation of a dispatch and voice logging system for Bonfield's Fire Department and first responders communications, Municipal Emergency Operations Center and Fire Hall #1.

The new system will provide capabilities such as voice dispatch, voice recording, event logging, and administrative reporting. This upgrade represents a significant step in supporting the Fire Department's critical work by ensuring that all calls and communications are digitally logged in real time. It will enhance operational efficiency, enable accurate and timely reporting, and allow Emergency Services to document and track lessons learned to continually improve service and response operations. Additionally, the system will assist in the timely response to emergencies, such as the major storm experienced in June 2025.

Free dump loads cannot be used in-lieu for items with set tipping fees i.e furniture, shingles or appliances.

This year's campaign, Charge into Fire Safety™ - Lithium-Ion Batteries in Your Home, works to educate everyone about using these batteries safely. The campaign stresses how important it is to BUY, CHARGE, and RECYCLE safely when it comes to lithium-ion batteries.

Did you know? Lithium-Ion batteries store a lot of energy in a small place. These batteries can overheat, start a fire or explode if overcharged or damaged. By learning how to BUY, CHARGE and RECYCLE these batteries safely, you can help prevent a fire in your home.

Burn Permits Required - April 1st to October 31st

Information regarding burn permits, and regulations for open air burning can be found in By-Law 2024-27. For small campfires, property owners only need to apply once, and the permit will be valid for the lifetime that they own the home. Campfire permits are free, while a \$50 fee and advance notice is required for brush or windrow fires.

Get your furnace or woodstove ready for winter

- Ensure woodstoves, fireplaces and fireplace inserts are installed by a qualified technician according to the manufacturer's instructions
- Have your heating system, vents and chimneys inspected and cleaned annually by a qualified service technician
- Ensure all outside heating vents are not blocked
- Let ashes from your woodstove or fireplace cool before emptying them into a metal container with a tight-fitting lid and keep the container outside

Test smoke alarms and CO2 detectors at least once every month

Test your smoke alarms every month by using the test button on the alarm. When the test button is pressed, the alarm should sound. If it fails to sound, make sure that the battery is installed correctly or install a new battery.



Clogged dryer vents are a leading cause of house fires. Stay safe—clean your lint trap after every load and have your dryer vent inspected and serviced regularly.





Consider choosing **battery- operated candles** over real
flames, especially around
children, pets, and decorations.

Keep **space heaters** at least one metre or three feet away from anything that can burn, including curtains, upholstery and clothing.


