Greetings from Mayor Narry Paquette and Council

As another year draws to a close, it is time to sit back and reflect on the happenings and progress within the township.

Council had a busy year. The Township tendered and appointed an Integrity Commissioner, Audit Firm, and Planning Consultants. There is an updated Procedural Bylaw, Donation Policy, Tax Policy and Unmaintained Roadway Policy. The Police Services Board was merged through Provincial legislation with the Boards from East Ferris and Chisholm. This creates a more streamlined service for the community.

The Bonfield Medical Center was renovated and welcomed two new doctors to our community. We also entered into an agreement with the Powassan and Family Health Team for affiliated services to support the doctors and the community. A new Board was also created that will continue to work on efficient operations and towards more health-related opportunities for Bonfield.

Our Community Garden was a great success this year and we thank the community for your help and support with this project! We are hoping to make some improvements for next year to grow the yields so more people will benefit.

The addition of new equipment to the Public Works department will help us continue to improve the roadways, with ditching and brushing. The gravel program will continue with more projects earmarked for 2025. The addition of a compactor will help prolong the lifespan of our landfill. Our Public Works department has been working very hard to make these improvements happen and it is noticeable! We are hopeful to learn we were successful on the Development Road funding by March 2025.

We are also hopeful for approved funding for better communication infrastructure for emergency response early in the new year. Our emergency responders are valuable to the community and having modern radios and response software will make their job easier. Council thanks our Volunteer Fire Department members for their continued commitment to the community of Bonfield.

Council is also proud of our new staff members in 2024 including our Chief Building Official Mike, Planning Administrator Simon, and our Public Works staff Courtney, Stephen, Paul and Richard.

2025 will continue to be ambitious with the finalization of the Short-Term Rental Bylaw, the Trailer Bylaw, and Asset Management and Level of Service reviews and a website redesign. The Official Plan is with the Ministry and should be ready for adoption by the end of 2025, then we can start on the full review of the comprehensive zoning bylaw. Council will be introducing an amending zoning bylaw to address some current trends including additional dwelling units, accessory uses and shipping container as well as permitting hunt camps. Council is also excited to release a Strategic Plan in 2025 that will guide decisions and budgeting for the next 5 to 10 years. Stay tuned for more information and on how you can help shape the future of Bonfield.

We want to thank all the staff as well as our volunteers for their hard work and dedication for another successful year. We look forward to 2025.

Winter Tips

- Overnight Parking: Prohibited on all streets from November 1 to March 31 between 12:00 am and 9:00 am.
- Snow on Roadways: Depositing snow or ice on roads is strictly prohibited under the Highway Traffic Act to prevent hazards for vehicles and pedestrians.
- Give Plows Space: Keep streets clear of parked vehicles and maintain a safe distance from snowplows to allow crews to work safely and efficiently.
- Plow Routes: Plowing routes are planned according to road classifications, with priority given to heavily trafficked roads, steep hills, and key connectors to secondary roads. This ensures safe and clear access for emergency vehicles and residents. See the Winter Operations Policy for more details.
