Council Supports the Recommendation of Promoting Firefighter Mason as Captain

Landfill Site Monitoring and Inspections

Council accepted the 2025 Annual Water Quality Summary Report, prepared by Pinchin Ltd., The report details a monitoring program that included groundwater, surface water, and potable well water sampling conducted in the spring, summer, and fall of 2025. In January 2026, the MECP conducted a physical site inspection and records audit of the landfill, which currently operates under a 1980 Provisional Certificate of Approval. The inspection found the site to be largely compliant with operational, reporting, and staffing requirements. The 2026 inspection utilized advanced technology, including a Remotely Piloted Aircraft System (drone), to document the site's current state. The Public Works Manager's report from February 2026 outlines the strategic and regulatory implications of the MECP's findings, emphasizing the need for early planning to define technical study requirements and forecast capital costs for the ECA modernization. To address specific MECP recommendations, the Township has already contacted its consultant, Pinchin Ltd., to implement a required Groundwater Flow Direction Survey during future inspections. Additionally, staff have measured approximately 3,000 feet of the waste disposal area that will require fencing to meet modern compliance standards. Failure to meet these MECP timelines could result in escalated enforcement measures, such as orders or increased environmental and liability risks.
