



## Free Dump Loads/Yard Clean Ups

### What's Allowed?

Each residence is entitled to 2 loads/year, resetting January 1st.

These loads are typically used when someone cleans out their house, garage, yard, etc., or have extra garbage and would like to avoid using their limited yearly bags (104 bags).

These loads are meant for bags of miscellaneous garbage and random junk and unwanted items that you would typically be charged for as a regular truck or trailer load.

#### Examples:

- Bags of garbage/household waste
- Cleaned out the fridge/freezer of old food
- Broken yard tools (rakes, shovels, etc.)
- Styrofoam
- Kids toys
- Old plastic lawn chairs
- Flower pots and plastic planting trays
- Plastic feed bags
- Plastic bail wrap

Free dump loads can **NOT** be used in-lieu for items with set tipping fees, i.e. furniture, fridge, shingles, etc., or for construction materials. **Regular charges still apply.**

#### These loads may **NOT** contain the following:

- Furniture (mattress, boxspring, couch, armchair, etc.)
- Construction materials (wood, insulation, siding, etc.)
- Shingles
- Fridge, freezer, or anything containing refrigerant
- Hazardous waste (this must be brought to the hazardous waste depot at 112 Patton St, North Bay.)

All materials being dumped from a Free Dump Load must be sorted and disposed of in the designated areas of the landfill. Please ask our attendants for direction if you aren't certain.

#### **Recyclable materials:**

Recyclable materials (plastic, tin, glass, paper and cardboard), electronics, and scrap metal have no dumping fees but **MUST** be recycled accordingly and not disposed of into the landfill.
