5. Presentations and Delegations Bonfield & District Lion's Club

Doug Cable provided a presentation outlining the Club's plans for Canada Day. As part of their activities, the Club would like to host its traditional Duck Race at 4:30 p.m and offer Caboose Tours starting at 4:00 p.m. The Lion's Club will also participate in the Township's main celebration by presenting a 25-Year Time Capsule at 7:30 pm.

6. Staff Reports

a. OAC Grant

An update was provided on the OAC Grant funding. Although one creative submission was received for the Art Installation, it did not fully align with the grant's criteria and as such it was not recommended to Council.

The Recreation Committee recommends pursuing an alternative project such as a mural installation within the park. The Committee feels that a mural will provide a more enduring artistic contribution to the community. Staff will engage with local artists and community arts organizations to explore mural concepts and determine a suitable location in Kaibuskong Park.

b. Canada Day

Staff provided a report on the updated timing of Canada Day events. Based on the Town Hall vote, the fireworks display will be held on Tuesday, July 1st. As a result, the Labour Day event has been cancelled.

Members suggested securing two musical acts; staff will contact local artists. Several volunteers have come forward, and the Committee supports including classic games such as races. Staff will confirm volunteer availability. For children's entertainment, staff will explore options such as rope courses and electronic tag. The Food Bank will be contacted to determine interest in operating the canteen.

7. Items for Committee Discussion

a. Easter Egg Hunt

The Easter Egg Hunt is set for Saturday, April 19th, from 12:00 pm to 2:00 pm. The event will be organized by age groups, with children collecting one empty egg of each color to exchange for a goodie bag from volunteers, ensuring all participants receive equal prizes. Donations have been requested and are being accepted at the Library and Township Office. The Reptile Camp will run a colouring contest. Mark Robinson has volunteered to take photos of the event.

b. Community Garden

Staff have been in contact with Ecole Lorraine, and the school would like to manage one of the beds at the Bonfield Community Garden. A call for vegetable donations has been issued. Staff will contact local arborist to obtain wood shavings.

c. Provincial Day of Action

The Committee discussed the upcoming Earth Day and Provincial Day of Action. Staff will reach out to the Lion's Club to discuss partnering with their plans on April 22nd to ensure a safe and successful day.

d. 2025 Recreation Budget

The Committee discussed the 2025 Recreation Budget and was tasked with bringing forward any ideas for events supported by the Committee at the next meeting. Additionally, members were asked to propose ideas for developing a 5-year plan for the Committee's actions and initiatives.

e. 2025 Events

In 2024 the suggestion was made to support an Angel Tree initiative for Christmas. Staff will reach out to the Lion's Club to discuss partnering with them as they already have a similar initiative.

OAC Grant - Mural in Kaibuskong Park

RECOMMENDATION:

That Council approve the appointment of Mique Michelle as the artist for the Kaibuskong Park mural project, funded through the Ontario Arts Council grant, to be completed by the end of May 2025, within the approved \$2,000 budget.

BACKGROUND:

The Township of Bonfield received funding from the Ontario Arts Council (OAC) to support the creation of public art that engages the community, enhances public spaces, and reflects local culture and identity. As you will recall the Rendez-Vous event held Friday February 7th, 2025 at the Community Centre was part of this funding to celebrate the arts in Bonfield.

As part of this initiative, the Recreation & Fitness Committee identified Kaibuskong Park as an ideal location for a community mural project. The mural will enhance the park's visual appeal, celebrate the community's character, and create a welcoming public art feature for both residents and visitors.

Mique Michelle, a professional muralist based in Northern Ontario, was approached regarding the project. With extensive experience creating community-based public murals across the region, Mique Michelle brings both creative expertise and a deep understanding of Northern Ontario communities.

Artist Profile - Mique Michelle

Mique Michelle is an accomplished and highly regarded muralist whose work reflects the cultural richness and natural beauty of Northern Ontario. With over a decade of experience, Michelle has worked on numerous public art projects, bringing her artistic vision to communities across the province.

Her murals often incorporate themes of local history, Indigenous culture, and the natural environment, creating pieces that resonate deeply with the communities in which they are placed. SITE SELECTION

Following a site walk-through, the front façade of the changeroom building in Kaibuskong Park was identified as the most suitable location for the mural.

Key factors for selecting this location include:

- High visibility from the street, welcoming park visitors and passersby.
- Protection from potential damage by park activities such as hockey and other recreational use.
- High pedestrian traffic, providing opportunities for interaction with the mural as people
 use the changeroom and surrounding park features.

PROJECT DETAILS

- Timeline: The mural is scheduled for completion by the end of May 2025.
- Budget: The project will be completed within the \$2,000 budget allocated through the Ontario Arts Council grant.
- Community Involvement: The Recreation & Fitness Committee and community
 volunteers will assist with priming the mural surface prior to painting, allowing the project
 to remain within budget and engage local residents in the creative process.
- Supplies: Mique Michelle will provide a full list of required paints and materials, all to be procured within the approved budget.

RECOMMENDATION:

That Council approve the appointment of Mique Michelle as the artist for the Kaibuskong Park mural project, funded through the Ontario Arts Council grant, to be completed by the end of May 2025, within the approved \$2,000 budget.

Artist Graffiti,


